

# The New Zealand Community Safety and Injury Prevention Awards 2005

These awards recognise, reward and promote best-practice community-based injury prevention and safety promotion in New Zealand.

Entry is open to:

- any group or organisation with an excellent safety or injury prevention initiative;
- any individual who has made a significant contribution to creating a safer community.

Winners receive \$2000 towards professional development, or the development of their safety initiative.

Entries close 5pm, Thursday 28 July 2005.

## **Category 1 – Outstanding community safety and/or injury prevention coalition**

Judging Criteria

- Demonstrates partnership and collaborations;
- Has representation and support from key stakeholders (government and non-government);
- Shows effective use of available resources; and
- Shows ongoing participation in regional and national community safety and/or injury prevention networks.

## **Category 2 – Outstanding community safety and/or injury prevention initiative or programme**

Judging Criteria

- Uses data to inform development and sustainability;
- Uses proven and promising community-based safety promotion and injury prevention strategies;
- Covers both genders, all ages, environments and situations or targets high-risk groups and environments;
- Incorporates evaluation to assess the programme, processes and effects of change; and
- Has the potential to be applied and developed elsewhere.

## **Category 3 – Outstanding example of the New Zealand Injury Prevention Strategy framework guiding the development of a community safety and/or injury prevention initiative or programme**

Judging Criteria

- Raises awareness of and commitment to injury prevention;
- Strengthens injury prevention capacity and capability;
- Develops and implements effective injury prevention interventions;
- Integrates injury prevention activity through collaboration and co-ordination; and
- Fosters leadership within the community.

## **Category 4 – Outstanding business or organisation that is contributing to the greater well-being of its own workforce and the community in general**

Judging Criteria

- Shows collaboration and partnerships with community groups and organisations working towards common goals of injury reduction and well-being in the community;
- Demonstrates initiatives to improve the health and well-being of the workforce and the community, beyond the prevention of injuries in the workplace;
- Shows that the employer has an awareness and appreciation of the community, and is working towards the greater well-being of the community.
